

Free guided tours are available for elementary, middle, and high school students and adult groups. Tours are available Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Tours require a minimum of 10 students and a maximum of 65. One chaperone is required for every 10 students. Tours are led by museum docents and are approximately 50 minutes in duration.

Self-guided tours are also permitted, however reservations are still needed at least four weeks in advance for groups of more than 10 people.

The Haggerty Museum of Art is located at 13th and Clybourn streets on the Marquette University campus in Milwaukee. It is accessible to people with disabilities.



Parking for Haggerty visitors is available in Marquette University's Lot J, accessed from 11th St. between Wisconsin and Clybourn. There are 15 spaces in the 85-space lot dedicated to Haggerty guests on a regular basis and other spaces in Lot J are available on a first-come, first-served basis for museum programs. Overflow parking is available in the Wells Street Parking Structure, entered on Wells just east of 13th St. or at metered spaces on Clybourn between 13th and 15th Streets.

Buses should drop students off on the south side of the museum at 13<sup>th</sup> and Clybourn Streets. If buses will be waiting for students while the tour is taking place, street parking is available on St. Paul Avenue.
