Description: An account from the journal of Reverend Pierre-Jean de Smet, S.J. of his trip accompanied by various Indian chiefs from St. Ignatius, Montana to Fort Vancouver, Washington for the purpose of reviewing a peace Treaty; from the Midwest Jesuit Archives, St. Louis, Missouri.
