Specificathere was a 2% decrease in robberies and a 5% decrease in burglaries over the same time period lastles dition, the Chief indicated there has been a 54% decrease in robberies from the January 2014 to December 2016 (a threeyear period). These numbers are based on crimes which appear in the MUPD Daily Crime Log, which reflects crimes in the entire patrol zone. The City of Milwaukee has not seen similar decreases, unfortunately. Mr. Stanley indicated that crime numbers in the Near Westside area arealso trending downward, and partially attributed that to the increased visibility of MUPD in that area.

Community Outreach. The Chief indicated that MUPD has intentionally made effortsuited strong community relationships. Examples include: NationightNOut, Coffee with a Cop, Neighborhood Coffee with a Cop, interaction and outreach to schools in the eage (Guadalupe andtSRose School).
